Drawing on interviews with those closest to the next president, the film provides insight into how Obama might lead the country. A personal and political biography, the film examines the key moments that shaped Obama, recounts how a freshman senator laid the groundwork for his historic run for the presidency, and asks what his election says about America.

The film begins with Obama's first appearance on the national stage at the 2004 Democratic convention and follows his carefully choreographed and meteoric rise to prominence within the Democratic Party. Along the way, filmmaker Michael Kirk examines how Obama's life experiences made him uniquely suited to launch a successful campaign to become the country's first black president. Obama's closest friends and advisors reveal how his time as a community organizer in Chicago, his election to the presidency of the Harvard Law Review, and rise to the top of Illinois politics taught him to navigate America's complicated racial and political divides.
