Today, Christianity is the largest religion in the world, with over two billion followers.

Join author and distinguished history professor Jonathan Phillips of Royal Holloway, University of London, as he sets out on a spectacular 12,000 mile journey of a lifetime, traveling the ancient roads to the very places where Christianity began. *The Road from Christ to Constantine* is a captivating adventure through four centuries and seven countries in the Middle East, North Africa, and Europe.

In six extraordinary episodes, Jonathan travels to the important religious sites where history was made, experiencing the sights and sounds of the past, and revealing the passionate stories, struggles, and triumphs of the early Christians. The series journeys into the fascinating world of the early Christians and meets experts who have devoted their lives to the study of this important historical period.

The Road from Christ to Constantine explores the triumphs and tribulations of Christianity's long struggle, reliving its pivotal moments at the actual locations where those events unfolded—from Judea where Jesus preached, through the sites where Paul the Apostle traveled to make the God of one nation into the God of all people, and finally to Rome, where Roman emperor Constantine the Great embraced the faith as his own.
