Between 1981 and 1990, five Vietnamese-American journalists in cities across the U.S. were murdered and many others in the community were intimidated and attacked. FRONTLINE and ProPublica reopen a domestic terrorism case that has gone unsolved for decades to ask: who was responsible for this reign of terror—and why has that question gone unanswered for so long?

For the most part, the murders were overlooked by the mainstream press. But FRONTLINE and ProPublica dug into the case, uncovering a trail pointing to an anti-communist paramilitary organization whose ultimate goal was to restart the Vietnam War—and who, the investigation confirms, operated a secret assassination squad in the U.S. targeting journalists and others who disagreed with them. Drawing on thousands of pages of documents—including newly declassified FBI files—FRONTLINE and ProPublica tracked down the victims' families, former law enforcement agents and Vietnamese Americans across the country to shed new light on an unsolved wave of domestic terror.
