The story of Jesus, has engrained itself into global consciousness as that of a mystical healer, teacher and Rabbi, who wandered pastoral lands and preached to his disciples in preparation for a divine kingdom to come, ultimately sacrificing his life for the sake of all. Yet in recent years, a growing number of religious experts and historians have begun to question the canonical version of events. Last Days of Jesus uncovers a different story about the man behind the myth—a revolutionary at the center of the political and religious turmoil of his time.
