First Face of America

The Gang Crackdown

In September 2016, two teenage girls were murdered in a cul-de-sac in a Long Island suburb, and months later the bodies of four teenage boys were found in the woods nearby. Both groups were hacked to death by machetes—the signature weapon of the MS-13 gang. These killings were part of more than a dozen murders involving MS-13 that have recently taken place on Long Island, home to one of the largest communities of migrant children fleeing from violence in Central America. President Trump has declared war on the gang and used these violent incidents to justify efforts to ramp up deportations, but organizations like the American Civil Liberties Union say that Hispanic youth—many of whom were harassed by violent gangs before resettling in the U.S.—are being targeted unfairly. FRONTLINE investigates and follows what happens to the youth who have been arrested by immigration officials, taken from their communities and placed in secure, prison-like facilities in California and Virginia—far away from their families and lawyers. **1x60** HD

THE BOMBING OF WALL STREET

On September 16, 1920, as hundreds of Wall Street workers headed out for lunch, a horse-drawn cart packed with dynamite exploded in front of Morgan Bank—the world's most powerful banking institution. For centuries, the Lithuanian city of Vilnius was one of the most important Jewish centers in the world, earning the title "Jerusalem of the North," until the Nazis destroyed it. About 95% of the Jewish population of Vilna, its name in Hebrew and Yiddish, was murdered and its synagogues and institutions were reduced to ruins. The Soviets finished the job, paving over the remnants of Vilna's famous Great Synagogue so thoroughly that few today know it ever existed.
