A crime that hides in plain sight, labor trafficking is so hard to identify and prosecute that no one—not the FBI, the Department of Labor, or the Justice Department—knows for sure the number of trafficking victims in the U.S. *Trafficked in America* draws on accounts from industry insiders, victims, and accused traffickers to show how the country's conflicted immigration system and underlying economic pressures are contributing to the abuse of young workers in industries we all depend on.
