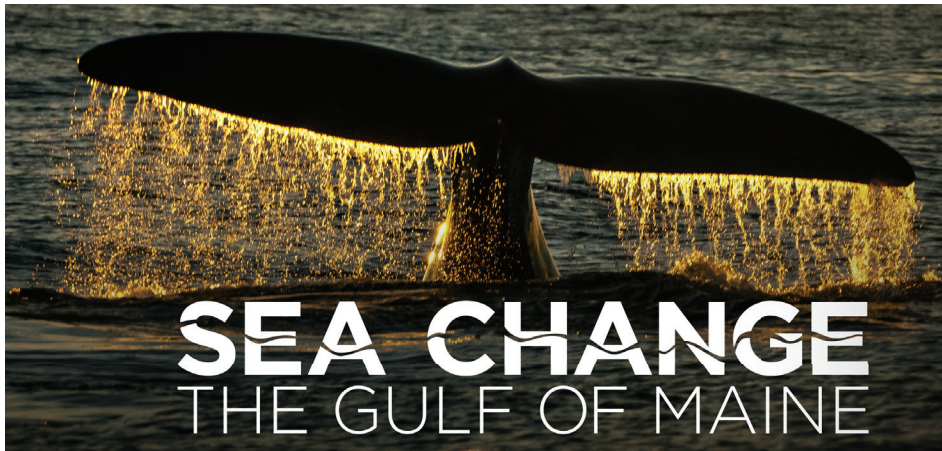

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY MARCH 8, 2025



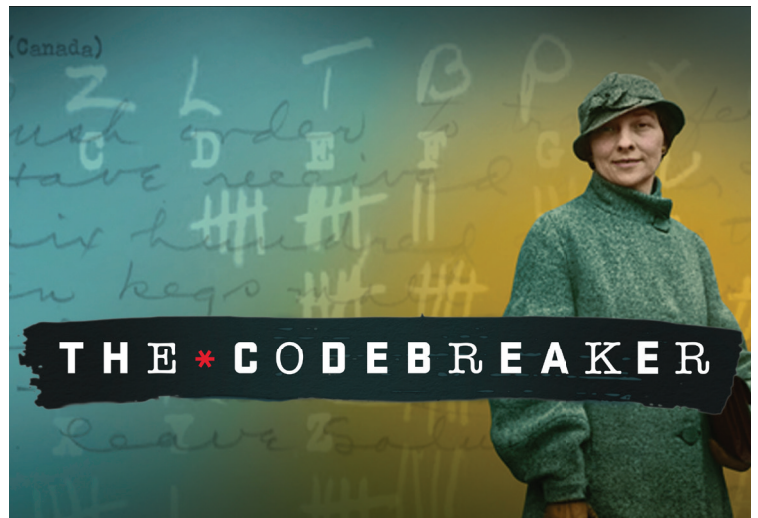

The Changemakers explores the lives of five pioneering women who shaped U.S. history 100 years ago. Featuring Martha Hughes Cannon, Jovita Idar, Jeannette Rankin, Mary Church Terrell, and Zitkála-Šá, the film highlights their roles in government, suffrage, and civil rights through rare archives and expert interviews. **1x60 | HD**



The Vote chronicles the intense, century-long struggle of American women for the right to vote, leading to the largest expansion of U.S. voting rights. From 1909 to 1920, suffrage leaders debated militant tactics, public protests, and redefined women's roles in society, challenging ideas of citizenship and democracy. **4x53, 2x113 | HD**



The Codebreaker tells the story of Elizebeth Smith Friedman, a pioneering cryptanalyst whose work decoding messages for the U.S. government helped imprison gangsters and dismantle a Nazi spy ring in WWII.
